CPCCLRG3001A – License to Perform Rigging Basic Level

Course Overview

This course is designed to give participants the knowledge and skills required to safely and efficiently perform basic rigging. The course covers regulations, safety requirements, steel erection, crane loading platforms, winch operations, reeving, knots, splicing, sling selection, static lines and material and mast climber hoists.

Duration

5 Days (4 days of training and 1 day for the SafeWork NSW Assessment)

Target

Individuals who would like to gain employment with a rail or civil operator or those that have already gained employment and need this skill set to commence work.

Entry Requirements

- Have sufficient knowledge of the English language
- Have successfully completed a Dogging course and hold a current License for High Risk Work in the class of Dogging (DG).
- Be over 18 years of age

Assessment

- Practical Assessment
- Calculations Assignment
- Knowledge Assessment

Learning Outcomes

- Take precautions to prevent accidents when erecting structural steel
- Work safely and confidently at heights using the correct harnesses
- Describe and demonstrate the use of rope blocks and tackle
- Identify and demonstrate the correct use of winches
- Erect and dismantle a cantilevered crane loading platform
- Erect a safety net and static line
- Erect safety screws or shudders
- Erect and dismantle materials hoist
- Pre-cast concrete placement



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On Completion

- Awarded with a Statement of Attainment for CPCCLRG3001A – License to perform rigging basic level.
- Eligible to apply to SafeWork NSW for their (RB) Rigging Basic Licence. This is a National High Risk Work (HRW) Licence. The application must be made within sixty (60) days at a NSW Post Office. You will be required to provide one hundred (100) points of identification (ID) plus a passport sized photo with your application.

Participant Requirements

Wear steel cap boots, a hard hat, safety glasses, long pants and hi visibility shirt/vest. You will also need wet weather gear if required.
